

#### THIRD STREET THEATRE SOCIETY



# STREET MAP

March 18, 1928 - Charlotte von Mahlsdorf is born in Berlin under the name Lothar Berfelde

**1919-1933 -** Period during the Weimar Republic government where Berlin became a hotbed of cultural innovation including a vibrant queer community

January 30, 1933 - Adolf Hitler comes to power in Germany

May 8, 1945 - Germany's unconditional surrender

**August 13, 1961 -** The Berlin Wall, 160km long, is erected overnight around West Berlin to prevent Eastern Berliners from entering the West. It was erected in response to a mass exodus of over 2 million East Germans fleeing to the West

**November 9, 1989 -** The Berlin Wall falls

October 3, 1990 - East and West Germany reunited
